JUDAH

(southern kingdom)

20 KINGS

Some unrighteous

Some <u>righteous</u>

Judah falls in 586 B.C.

ISRAEL

(northern kingdom)
20 KINGS

All unrighteous

Israel falls in 722 B.C.

The Prophets

God raised up prophets who spoke his words of judgement and mercy & future hope to the people.

Isaiah: a prophet to <u>Judah</u>

- -Spoke for God for over 4 decades and the rule of 4 kings (Uzziah, Ahaz, Hezekiah. . .)
- -Warned Judah not to trust in idols or other nations but the Lord.
- -Pointed to the coming savior, the <u>suffering servant</u>.

Jeremiah: the "weeping prophet" to Judah

- -Presented God's word of judgement against Judah
- -Jeremiah's story of <u>rejection</u> by Judah was a picture of their rebellion against God.
- -Jeremiah shared God's message of future restoration, forgiveness and a new covenant.

<u>Lamentations</u>: a "funeral dirge" written by Jermiah

- -Acknowledged Judah's <u>sin</u>.
- -Brutally <u>honest</u> with God about spiritual and emotional <u>pain</u>.
- -Found <u>hope</u> in God's <u>faithfulness</u>.

Micah: a prophet to Judah

-God has found His people guilty, but there is forgiveness for those who return to the Lord.

Nahum: a prophet to <u>Ninevah</u> (the capital of Assyria)

-100 years after Ninevah repented, God declares coming judgement.

Habakkuk: a prophet to Israel

- -Habakkuk asks why evil is not punished and God does not answer.
- -God reveals that He will use <u>Babylon</u> to punish Judah, but they will also later be punished.

Zephaniah: a prophet to <u>Israel</u>

-The "Day of the Lord" will be a terrible day of judgement, but there is a future hope.
